

## Cranbrook & Sissinghurst Parish Council Action Plan 2023/24

## During the Council year 2023/24 Cranbrook & Sissinghurst Parish Council will undertake the following actions:

• Maintain, improve and promote the use of recreation grounds, open spaces and Vestry Hall Complex

• Maintain allotments, burial grounds, car parks, streetlights, public toilets and other street furniture

• Comment on all planning applications which fall within or impact on the Parish.

• Represent the views and promote the interests of the parish, particularly in relation Tunbridge Wells Borough Council and Kent County Council.

• Engage with the community, including parishioners, local businesses, community groups and organisations in the parish, including by maintaining an up-to-date website and social media presence, in line with the Community Engagement Policy.

• Listen, investigate and respond to issues identified in the parish of Cranbrook & Sissinghurst and, if appropriate, to signpost to the correct person/ organisation for resolution/ further progression.

• Work with and support local groups for the improvement of the facilities, environment and social and economic wellbeing in the community.

• Deliver speedy and transparent decisions through full meetings of the Council, supported by appropriate committees.

• Promote training and induction and ongoing support for members of staff and councillors.

• Maintain good governance, including adhering to relevant benchmarks to achieve Quality Status of the Local Council Award Scheme.

• Fulfil responsibilities as Sole Trustee to three Charities: Tomlin Murton (Charity no. 302718), Jubilee Field (Charity no. 302842) and War Memorial (Charity no. 238480)

## Key projects for 2023/2024 include:

- Highways Improvement Plan
- Ball Field Play Area develop plans for improvements
- Tree Safety Audit routine safety check
- Community/Medical Centre, including demolition of Tanyard Surgery
- Develop public consultation policy
- Vestry Hall insulation improvements including secondary glazing and thermally lined curtains
- Neighbourhood Development Plan progress to referendum
- Reline parking spaces in Jockey Lane car park
